

Clinical Psychologist Opportunity at ACUTE Center for Eating Disorders at Denver Health

Denver Health & Hospital is actively recruiting for a full-time Clinical Psychologist for the ACUTE Center for Eating Disorders. The licensed, doctoral-level psychologist will provide clinical services for patients as part of a multidisciplinary team on ACUTE's inpatient medical stabilization unit.

About the Position

The ACUTE Center for Eating Disorders at Denver Health is the nationwide referral center for medical stabilization of patients with severe malnutrition, often due to eating disorders. ACUTE was founded in its current form in 2008 specifically to provide definitive medical stabilization for adults whose eating disorders have become too critical to receive care safely even in inpatient or residential eating disorder facilities. We are the highest volume center in the country with multidisciplinary expertise in managing the medical complications of severe starvation.

Services will include expert diagnostic assessment, individual psychotherapy, and consultation/coordination within the multidisciplinary team. The psychologists also provide case coordination and outreach as needed. Functions as an integral member of the interdisciplinary team and provides clinical teaching and leadership for other staff members.

As part of the ACUTE team, opportunities for involvement in eating disorder related research projects as well as supervision of trainees may be available.

Minimum Qualifications

- Licensed as a Psychologist by the State of Colorado.
- Doctoral degree in psychology.
- Previous experience of 4000 hours supervised clinical service, including completion of doctoral internship and one year postdoctoral experience; 2000 hours providing behavioral health services.
- Advanced knowledge and skills in effective psychological practice with eating disorder population.
- Familiarity with integrated behavioral health care and comfort working within a fast-paced medical setting.
- •Can participate as a faculty member with the psychology internship and training program.



• Able to provide psychodiagnostic assessment, intervention and patient education for patients with severe eating disorders.
